

1 La Salle Prayer Service (15min)

Theme: *United in Faith, Service, and Education* **Duration**: 15 minutes

1. Opening Song or Reflection (2 minutes)

Invite participants to reflect silently as the following quote is read aloud:
"For the Lasallian educator, faith is a call to action – to be the hands and feet of Christ in a world that yearns for justice and compassion."

2. Welcome and Introduction (2 minutes)

Leader:

"Today, we gather as a community to pray for global solidarity and to reflect on our shared mission with the 1 La Salle Project. Together, we are part of a worldwide Lasallian family dedicated to providing education, compassion, and hope to those most in need. Let us open our hearts to the call of Christ to serve as one united body, inspired by the values of faith, service, and community."

3. Scripture Reading (3 minutes)

Reader:

A reading from the Gospel of Matthew (25:35-40):

"For I was hungry and you gave me food, I was thirsty and you gave me something to drink, I was a stranger and you welcomed me, I was naked and you gave me clothing, I was sick and you took care of me, I was in prison and you visited me.





Then the righteous will answer him,

'Lord, when was it that we saw you hungry and gave you food, or thirsty and gave you something to drink? And when was it that we saw you a stranger and welcomed you, or naked and gave you clothing? And when was it that we saw you sick or in prison and visited you?' And the king will answer them, 'Truly I tell you, just as you did it to one of the least of these who are members of my family, you did it to me.'"

4. Reflection (3 minutes)

Leader:

"As we reflect on this Scripture, let us consider how the mission of the 1 La Salle Project embodies these words of Jesus. Around the world, Lasallian schools are transforming lives through education, offering opportunities to those who might otherwise be forgotten. The call to global solidarity reminds us that we are all part of one human family, united in Christ, and that our actions can bring hope to others. Together, we can respond to the needs of our brothers and sisters by sharing our resources, our talents, and our prayers."

5. Intercessions (3 minutes)

Leader:

"Let us now lift our prayers to God for our Lasallian family and all those we serve through the 1 La Salle Project."

Response: "Lord, unite us in Your love."

- For the Lasallian schools around the world, that they may continue to provide education, hope, and opportunities to the most vulnerable. *We pray to the Lord.*
- For students and educators in challenging circumstances, that they may find strength and perseverance in their mission. *We pray to the Lord.*
- For the success of the 1 La Salle Project, that it may inspire generosity and solidarity within our global community. *We pray to the Lord.*
- For our own school community, that we may respond to the call to serve others with open hearts and hands.
