Monday

In one week we will celebrate Founder's Day! What does that mean and why do we celebrate? Founder's Day is a day when certain Catholic orders celebrate the founder of their charism, or institution. Our founder is St. John Baptist de La Salle, hence why we ask him to pray for us after every prayer. De La Salle had deep concern for the young, especially the poor, to receive a human and Christian education.
